A New Streamlined Structure

As part of our Healthy Church Initiative recommendations, Saint Paul's UMC has been working to streamline the leadership structure of the congregation. The changes are intended to encourage more people to serve in active ministry and have fewer people who need to be spending their time in meetings. The smaller committee structures will mean that while our smaller leadership teams will set the vision and organize the ministry of our congregation, it will take ALL of the people of Saint Paul's UMC to work together to move forward in ministry. We thank the many volunteers who are stepping down from formal committee meetings but continuing to use their gifts and wisdom to help lead Saint Paul's UMC in a faithful direction.

We will try out the new changes for a season, evaluating them in six months and again in twelve months, adjusting as necessary for effective leadership. Committee membership is in place for: Operations, Foundation, and


Finance, with the areas of Outreach and Member Enrichment still developing. The following chart shows the new committee names, areas of responsibility, and committee chairpersons for the new committees. A central (middle of the chart) leadership team is made up of each of the committee chairpersons, our lay member of annual conference, and a young adult representative. 
Prizes: This year's grand prize is a \$500 shopping trip to a local retailer of the winner's choice!

Support of our church and its mission



Pastor Amy Jo has previously written about the structural changes to our organization as a result of the recommendations from the Healthy Church Initiative. One of the goals of the new structure was to free up the time people spend in meetings so as to provide more time for supporting the mission of our church. The new finance committee has been put in place and we are a smaller group. We thank those who have served on the finance committee in the past years. One of the other tenants of the new structure is to make use of ad hoc committees to complete specific tasks. I hope that when we call to ask for assistance we can count on your support. The new team is made up of the following members:

You'll notice that memorials and what we traditionally thought of as finance are now one team. The commonality of the work in both areas supports the combining of these efforts. Rhea has worked with memorials for some time and will continue to bring her background and expertise.

We have three things that have been purchased this year with memorial funds; planters and flowers for the entries to the building, Spark Story Bibles for children to use during worship and three Handbell music stands. Here is an update on our finances through June. As you can see, we are running at a slight deficit (excluding apportionments) through the first six months of the year. Expenses are in good shape and everyone is doing their part to spend thoughtfully. Our operating budget for the year is \$277,633. If we had paid the apportionments due through the first six months, we would have spent \$136,782.20 or about \$3000 less than what would be expected for the first six months of the year.


