REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR AMY JO

YEAR OF RELATIONSHIP 2020 RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD: FACETS OF GOD

As we continue with our Year of Relationship 2020, we are engaging our relationship with God through a sermon series on the many images of God. The images that we hold of God shape the ways that we relate to God. While we can never fully know or understand God, the many and varied images that are used in the Bible to describe God each give us a different facet of the full nature of God. During worship some of the people of Saint Paul's UMC will be sharing a few words about what each image means to them, or how that image shapes the way they relate to God.

We began this sermon series with a worship service focusing on God as our Creator and how we relate to God with awe and wonder. These images fill our hymnal, including the famous second verse of How Great Thou Art:

At that first worship service, Barb Helmken shared pictures and memories of how visiting the North Shore is inspirational for her. We will continue, as we consider how we relate to God as: Holy Mystery, Friend, Shepherd, King, Wisdom, Guide, Father, and Advocate.

No image is complete in itself, but each one helps us to understand a different aspect of the nature of God.

During February, as the world is celebrating Valentine's Day, it might also be a good time to consider the image of God in I John: "God is love." The Minnesota Annual Conference is suggesting a Lenten book study of *Reckless* Love: Jesus' Call to Love our Neighbor by Tom Berlin. The book opens with the idea that if we want to really love God, then we should begin by loving the people that we meet each day. This helps us to understand the way in which our relationships are connected: Loving God helps us to better love our neighbor, and loving our neighbor helps us to better love God. May this Valentine's Day be full of God's reckless love in your life!

CONFIRMATION 2019-20

In January our lesson was on *Seasons of Faith*, we discussed how, as one grows, they pass through different phases of faith Development—how it is different for every person, and how we can stay in a particular phase of faith development for a long time or even revert back to a previous stage, but one is not better than the other. It is all about how we are connecting with God and responding to His grace.

• Experienced Faith:

Common in younger years or the introduction into a faith life, and involves the imitation of actions. For example: a child may pray the Lord's Prayer without grasping the full meaning of all the words, but since it is something that everyone else is doing they learn how to say it.

Affiliative Faith:

The dominant characteristic is belonging to a group. The individual identifies with a faith community where he or she feels a sense of belonging, and in which his or her beliefs and actions are rooted. Many confirmands, especially at the start of their confirmation journey are in this stage.

Searching Faith:

Connected with the formation of identity. A stage where we begin an internal and external dialog of what we believe and why. This stage of faith adds a cognitive dimension to a person's faith journey, and a person going

through the stage of searching faith begins to integrate head and heart.

Owned Faith:

It can come about only as a result of growing through Searching Faith. This is a stage of strong, vital faith that one lives by, stands by, and expresses to others. Growing into this stage does not mean one stops having or asking questions, but instead, that one has learned to embrace questions as a means to further grow and deepen one's spiritual connection with God and others.

Since we are nearing the end of Confirmation classes for this group, we also discussed what would help them continue to grow and blossom spiritually post confirmation. The students made lists of what would help them, and what would hinder their growth, and then wrote letters to their future selves that will be mailed to them post confirmation to remind them of what we talked about.

Our next confirmation class is February 12th and we will be discussing *History of the Church -both the history of the United Methodist Church as well as history of St. Paul's UMC.*

ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE FEBRUARY 26th 12:30—1:00 pm

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. It marks the beginning of a period of reflection and penance. In the Bible, sprinkling oneself with ashes was traditionally a sign of one's sorrow for having committed sins. In the Christian tradition, Ash Wednesday also marked the beginning of preparation for the understanding of the death and resurrection of Christ. The particular symbolism of ashes for this day comes from a practice in the Roman Catholic churches in which the ashes from the palms used in the preceding year's Palm Sunday celebration are blessed. With these ashes, the priest on the first day of Lent marks a cross on the forehead of each worshiper. This practice has become a part of Ash Wednesday services in many United Methodist churches. Please join us at 12:30 pm for this time of making a new start.

MN FOODSHARE MARCH CAMPAIGN

The Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign is almost here! This annual food and fund drive helps Neighbors stock the shelves for the busy summer months ahead, plus the amount they raise plays a role in how much FoodShare funding they receive later in the year – so a donation now goes even further. If questions, contact Jude Rikala 651-454-6885.

This is the largest grassroots food and fund drive in the state. Your donations help stock nearly 300 food shelves statewide. Last year the March campaign brought in \$8 million and 5.1 million pounds of food shelf items. Items needed include:

- **Protein items-** canned meat/fish, beans, nut butters
- Rice: white, wild, brown and Hamburger Helper, all types
- Gluten-free flour and flour blends
- Personal care items: shampoo/soap, toothpaste, diapers, toilet paper
- Household supplies: laundry and dish detergent, paper towels
- Breakfast foods: pancake mix and syrup

December and January are very busy times of the year. Personally, we are celebrating the birth of baby Jesus and the beginning of a new year. For church finances it is also a busy time as in December we wrap up 2019 and in January we provide an annual report of church finances for the previous year. The books are still in the process of being closed but the following information will be within a few dollars of actual numbers.

We ended the year with great news. All of our obligations were met; we paid our year-end bills, including apportionments due the MN Conference! Thank you to all who helped make this happen. Also on the good news side of the 2019 ledger, we were able to repair the roof (\$15,315) and pay the street assessment (\$22,000) because we have a healthy capital fund that has been invested wisely and provided the funds necessary for these large and unexpected expenses. Last, but very important, expenses were well controlled for the year. Our General Fund expenditures were \$277,085 against a planned budget of \$277,633. Well done!

Often a rosy picture also has some areas of concern. We continue to borrow internally from other funds,

such as memorials and mission, to pay the operating expenses that should be paid out of the general fund income. Bottom-line, our annual general fund contributions are not as much as our annual general fund expenses. This has been a trend for three of the last four years. During this year, your Central Leadership Team will be considering options for reversing the trend.

I would also like to give you a quick update on 2020 pledges. As of 1/8/2020, we have received 54 pledges, two less than last year. Total dollars pledged were \$190,890, an increase of \$8,212. For 2020, 28 pledges were an increase and there were 9 new pledges. If you haven't completed a pledge card yet, it isn't too late. You can pick one up in the office, complete it and return it to the office. Thanks to all who have pledged as this information helps us plan and manage our finances.

We have declared 2020 as the Year of Relationships in our church. The financial support you provide is a piece of the puzzle that helps us to build relationships with God, our fellow members at St. Paul's UMC and the greater community in which we live and work in.
