#### REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR AMY JO

Throughout the summer months, the grounds of Saint Paul's UMC have been a busy place. Volunteers from our congregation, as well as 4-H students, an Eagle Scout, and volunteer gardeners from the neighborhood have been working together in order to clear invasive species from the property, encourage the growth of hardy, native

plants both in the wooded areas and in the rain gardens, and repair the sprinkler system. The playground has been busy too, with members of our own congregation and our neighbors stopping in to play and enjoy Wednesday afternoon story times. One of our benches has been moved nearer to the playground, and grown-ups are using it to enjoy books from the Little Free Library while

their children/grandchildren are playing. The walking path has seen substantial use with people and pets from the neighborhood, and potted flowers welcome people at the entrances of the building. I thank all of the many volunteers who have worked to make the grounds of Saint Paul's UMC such a welcom-

ing place! Hospitality is a Christian virtue that we are practicing well when we improve the grounds to welcome the people, pets, and pollinators of our neighborhood.

At the same time that many volunteers have been working on the exterior grounds at Saint Paul's UMC, we have also begun planning indoor renovations related to guest readiness. We thank the Operations Team for leading this process, and their article in this Epistle gives many more details about the work (both indoors and outdoors). I am very excited for the improvements in audio and video quality that will come with these improvements, as

well as a refreshing update in aesthetics. It is my hope that these coming renovations will improve the indoor hospitality at Saint Paul's, making the interior of our building even more welcoming. Once again, it is good to be back together in person this summer, including back together in indoor worship! Christmas in July was a joy filled special worship service,

and I am already looking forward to our kick-off Sunday for Sunday School in September.

Have you been back to participate in the life of Saint Paul's UMC in person this summer? Your church family welcomes you home!

#### **OPERATIONS TEAM ACTIVITIES - WHAT'S HAPPENING?**

Tree branches and mulch in the parking lot? Grass is a golden-brown desert? A bench from the front door has been moved to the playground? There are rumors how plans are going regarding the Healthy Church Initiative...

Let me update information about the challenges faced as we have reopened the church and are identifying actions in support of the Healthy Church Initiative.

There have been significant projects that have been enhanced through the multiple contributions from over 30 different individuals from congregation, neighborhood, and other volunteer sources!

## Attention to the exterior grounds and siding from Fall, 2020 to present:

Pruning of tree limbs, shrubs around the church, and removal (cutting down, treating stumps, hauling and disposing) of invasive species of plants and trees from the areas behind the church. Installation and care of erosion control gardens. We received assessment/ guidance volunteered by county specialists and master gardeners. Volunteers from congregation members, plant specialists, and neighbors contributed many hours to many projects.

Invasive trees and shrubs were removed and shredded for use as mulch.

A 4-H group worked to lay cardboard and cover it with mulch along the church parking lot.

A young man from the group took on a project of shifting hoses and watering plants for many weeks.

A professional tree service was clearing trees along electrical lines and contributed chippings from their work.

The mulch distribution continues, and a wheelbarrow has been purchased.

Woodpecker damage to the siding on the back of the church: repaired/repainted

One of the benches from the front of the church was relocated to the playground.

Church volunteers repaired/ readied the multi-problem irrigation system; still being monitored.

#### Interior issues addressed:

Windows cleaned inside and outside via a significant donation by a member of the congregation.

A team of volunteers is assessing classrooms equipment/supplies and needs.

Plumbing repairs made in the men's and woman's bathrooms and to one of the faucets in the kitchen.

In the kitchen: the refrigerator was replaced, the stove and hood were certified clean of fire hazard, a hydro test was conducted to inspect and recertify the fire suppression components of the stove hood.

A background noise issue with the sound system has been

remedied.

### **Update on projects of the Healthy Church Initiative: (Ongoing)**

Options to refreshing/updating of the church have been explored and we hope to have recommendations to Leadership Team considerations by Fall.

A Color and Carpet Ad Hoc Team has agreed on color options for paint and flooring.

We have researched: paint colors; flooring options; installation of T-Loop technology (improves listening for hearing impaired); installing a ramp to the altar level; audio-vVisual sound, camera, projection and recording systems; and pew/seating options.

Potential vendors have been identified in each project area. No Request for Bids has occurred as each project is to be defined as to scope, quality, timeliness and cost.

Among the many teams supporting this church, we are responsively linked with other Teams of the Church to refresh and maintain this welcoming oasis of spiritual learning, sharing and caring.

Let us know as you have ideas for projects and would like an opportunity to help.

#### **OUTREACH UPDATE**

Our theme for outreach this summer is "our building is our best billboard," and we have several activities in the works to help welcome the people to the church. In partnership with the Operations team, we have relocated a bench to provide seating for people whose children are playing on the playground. Based on feedback from neighbors we will also be installing a simple "All Are Welcome Here" sign so that people in the community know that the playground space is available for their use.

Many of you know that John Grinager and many others have been doing amazing work on the church grounds, and we'll be showcasing these improvements during National Night Out on Tuesday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>. Those improvements include removing buckthorn and diseased trees and noxious weeds, and working with a Master Gardener to introduce more native plants and build biodiversity. • They have been important for both curb appeal and ecological restoration, and by showcasing them we hope to both inspire congregation members and spark interest with community members.

We've also been considering a Weeding and Watering class as an opportunity for congregation members - and the community at large - to learn more about how to care for our green spaces in support of the Methodist "Earthkeepers" mission. Expect more details soon!




