The UMC has a proud history of respecting labor and supporting workers. Here are four such stances from our recent Social Principles. The 2025-2028 Social Principles are now available from Cokesbury.

Collective Bargaining: "We support the right of all public and private employees and employers to organize for collective bargaining into unions and other groups of their own choosing. Further, we support the right of both parties to protection in so doing and their responsibility to bargain in good faith within the framework of the public interest. In order that the rights of all members of the society may be maintained and promoted, we support innovative bargaining procedures that include representatives of the public interest in negotiation... We reject the use of violence by either party during collective bargaining or any labor/management disagreement. We likewise reject the permanent replacement of a worker who engages in a lawful strike."

Work and Leisure: "Every person has the right to a job at a living wage. Where the private sector cannot or does not provide jobs for all who seek and need them, it is the responsibility of government to provide for the creation of such jobs... We believe that persons come before profits. We deplore the selfish spirit that often pervades our economic life... We support policies that would reverse the increasing concentration of business and industry into monopolies."

Consumption: "Consumers should exercise their economic power to encourage the manufacture of goods that are necessary and beneficial to humanity while avoiding the desecration of the environment in either production or consumption. Consumers should avoid purchasing products made in conditions where workers are being exploited...We call upon consumers, including local congregations and Church-related institutions, to organize to achieve these goals..." Poverty: "...As a church, we are called to support the poor and challenge the rich. To begin to alleviate poverty, we support such policies as: adequate income maintenance, quality education, decent housing, job training, meaningful employment opportunities, adequate medical and hospital care, humanization and radical revisions of welfare programs, work for peace in conflict areas and efforts to protect creation's integrity. Since low wages are often a cause of poverty, employers should pay their employees a wage that does not require them to depend upon government subsidies...Poverty most often has systemic causes, and therefore we do not hold poor people morally responsible for their economic state."


