

Growing in Christ: A Journey of Faithful Stewardship

As the leaves change and we enter this new season, we are also embarking on a new spiritual season: our annual Stewardship Campaign. Our theme for the year, "Growing in Christ", is an invitation for each of us to consider how our lives - our time, talents, and treasures - can be a fertile ground for God's work. Stewardship is not simply about what we give, but about how we live.

This year, our campaign will focus on five key practices that help us grow more deeply rooted in our faith.

1. Celebration: A life of good stewardship begins with a spirit of gratitude. We celebrate the

abundant blessings God has poured into our lives. Celebration reminds us that all we have is a gift, and a joyful heart is the first step toward generosity. Let us take time to celebrate and give thanks for God's overwhelming grace.

- 2. Servanthood: Following Jesus means adopting the mindset of a servant. Jesus himself humbled himself to serve others, and he calls us lives and are equipped to live as to do the same. This campaign is a chance to reflect on how we can use our unique gifts to serve one another within the church and our wider community.
- 3. Listening for the Holy Spirit: A growing relationship with Christ involves intentional listening. The Holy in a way that points others toward Spirit guides and empowers us, but we Jesus. 
attend.
